POLICY AND PROCEDURE

| TITLE: | Internal Course Substitutions |
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POLICY STATEMENT:

Internal substitutions are created when extenuating circumstances require one Goodwin course to be used in place of another Goodwin course to satisfy a requirement in a student's chosen program of study. Internal substitutions are created for individual students on a singular basis and should not be set as precedents for the award of credit for other students.

PROCEDURE DETAILS:

Upon assessment of an individual student's coursework, a Program Director or Dean may determine that a substitution of one Goodwin course for another is appropriate. Extenuating circumstances may include, but are not limited to:

- Current offerings in the course schedules do not allow a student to take a required course, thereby preventing completion of the program in accordance with the student's anticipated date of graduation.
- Change in course code (where the student took the course under the old code, but the student's current program lists the new course code)
